Mr. Hughes said the land that was being offered for sale was being salvaged by these people.

Mr. Livingston said he had never seen such a deal in his life, and he did not think the County had any idea of what this was going to cost to grade and level this land.

Mr. Viskovich said they would like the Legislators to see what was going on, and the land would not be sold without being seen.

Mr. Livingston said this is going to cost the taxpayers a lot of money.

Mr. Viskovich replied that it would not cost them any money right now.

Mr. Hughes felt the benefits derived from the gravel for road bedding would more than pay for the salvaging and the original cost of the bid.

Mr. Livingston said some people think you will not get enough money from this to pay for the bid. He also felt that after stripping the land down, the people on the windward side of the lot would be very unhappy and the County could be put out of business.

Mr. Hughes said no, these were good lots and he felt the towns were happy with the salvaging.

Mr. Livingston said we are not talking about townships, but people.

Mr. Hughes said they are desirable lots, and more than the original bid will be gotten back.

Mr. Martin moved the introduction of St. Lawrence County Local Law No. 4 for year 1975. The motion was seconded by Mr. Peters and was carried.

ST. LAWRENCE COUNTY
LOCAL LAW NO. 4 FOR THE YEAR 1975

1975

Be it enacted by the Board of Legislators of the County of St. Lawrence as follows:

Section 1. The Board of Legislators shall meet to organize and select a Chairman on or before the eighth day of January in each even-numbered year.

Section 2. This Local Law shall become effective upon filing a certified copy in the Office of the Secretary of State.

Chairman Healey said there would be a Public Hearing on this Local Law on June 9, 1975, at 6:55 P.M.

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Mr. Harrington asked if the money for the door would come from Mr. Kitchin's account and did Mr. Kitchin authorize the new door.

Mr. Greco said he thought Mr. Kitchin had requested the door which to him constituted authorization. He felt that since Mr. Kitchin asked for the door, his department should pay for it.

Mr. Livingston said Mr. Kitchin had asked for a door and he got it. He felt the Committee was at fault in this matter.

Mr. Johnson presented the report of the Community Services Committee.

Mr. Greco reported for the Finance Committee in the absence of Mr. Rishe, Chairman, Finance Committee.

Mr. LaBaff presented the report of the Economic Development Committee.

Mr. Cook presented the report of the Personnel Committee. He said they had five interviews scheduled for Wednesday, March 12, 1975, for the position of Director of Data Processing. He extended an invitation to any Legislator who wished to attend these interviews.

Mr. Hughes reported for the Planning and Conservation Committee.

Mr. C. Cooke presented the report for the Public Safety Committee.

Mr. Viskovich reported for the Transportation Committee.

Mr. Thompson presented the report of the Social Services Committee.

Mr. Harrington moved the introduction of Local Law No. 4 for the year 1975. The motion was seconded by Mr. Martin and carried.

LOCAL LAW NO. 4 FOR THE YEAR 1975

1975

Be it enacted by the Board of Legislators of the County of St. Lawrence as follows:

Section 1. The Board of Legislators shall meet to organize and select a chairman on or before the eighth day of January in each even-numbered year.

Section 2. No member of the Board of Legislators shall be eligible to serve as Chairman of the Board of Legislators unless he has been elected to the office of Chairman of the Board of Legislators for a term of at least one year.

Section 3. This act shall take effect on the first day of April 14, 1975, at 6 o'clock in the morning.

Mr. Harrington moved the adoption of the foregoing resolution. The motion was seconded by Mr. Johnson and carried.

By Mr. Harrington:

BE IT RESOLVED, That the Board of Legislators do hereby enact the following resolution:

All members of the Board of Legislators shall be eligible to serve as Chairman of the Board of Legislators unless he has been elected to the office of Chairman of the Board of Legislators for a term of at least one year.

Mr. Harrington moved the adoption of the foregoing resolution. The motion was seconded by Mr. Johnson and carried.

Mr. Viskovich moved the adoption of the foregoing resolution. The motion was seconded by Mr. Johnson and carried.

Mr. Peters moved the adoption of the foregoing resolution. The motion was seconded by Mr. Johnson and carried.

Section 2. No member of the Board may hold the position of Chairman of the Board for more than four years consecutively.

Mr. Harrington presented Resolution No. 31—75 and moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Mr. LaBaff.

RESOLUTION NO. 31—75

AMENDMENT TO THE RULES
By Mr. Harrington, Chairman, Legislative & Judicial Committee

BE IT RESOLVED that the Rules of Procedure of the Board of Legislators be amended as follows to VII. e) 1. a sentence be added:

All committee meetings will be held at 7:00 P.M.

Mr. Harrington said this came out of the Resolution that Mr. Greco had presented at the last Board meeting and his committee had agreed on it five to nothing.

Mr. Viskovich felt that having committee meetings in the evenings takes away the possibility of working with the department heads. He felt it should be left to the discretion of the chairman of each committee to decide what time to have their meetings.

Mr. Peters said he had talked to some of the department heads and had found no reluctance to attend evening meetings.

Mr. Howard felt this was setting a bad precedent to tell each Committee Chairman they must have evening meetings.

Mr. Greco said it was not possible to satisfy everyone on the Board. He quoted from Section 7E-Sub Section 6 of the rules and said are we going to have meetings when the public can come and speak out or not. He added that according to Section 7E, Paragraph 2, all meetings will be filed one week in advance and this is being ignored by most of the committees.

Mr. Johnson stated his opposition to the resolution and said people come when there is an issue on the Agenda whether it is night or day. He added he could see no reason to have meetings at night just because a few members of the board wanted it that way.

Mr. LaBaff agreed with Mr. Greco that night meetings gave the public more opportunity to come to the meetings.

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
