RESOLUTION NO. 10 - 73

Release of Federal Emergency Funds

WHEREAS, the past year has been disastrous for farmers in the County; and

WHEREAS, Congress enacted emergency measures to assist farmers; and

WHEREAS, President Nixon has frozen emergency funds;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, this Board will go on record as requesting the program be tightened to meet the real needs and eliminate the \$5,000 forgiveness, and that these funds be immediately unfrozen and copies be sent to the President, Agriculture Secretary Butz, Senators Javits and Buckley, and Congressman McEwen.
