ARTICLE I Quorum

A majority of the duly constituted membership of the Board of Legislators shall constitute a quorum.

ARTICLE II Meetings

- A. The Organizational Meeting shall be called pursuant to Section 151 of the County Law. At such Organizational Meeting, the Board will elect a Temporary Chair, Chair, and a Vice Chair.
- B. The Regular Meetings of the Board of Legislators shall be held as identified in Attachment A, or by resolution during a regular meeting or special meeting, the Legislature may determine a date and time for the next meeting.
- C. Special Meetings shall be held at the call of the Clerk upon direction of the Chair or upon written request signed by a majority of the members of the Legislature.

ARTICLE III Order of Business

The Order of Business at each session, except as may be set apart for the consideration of matters for which a Special Meeting has been called, shall be as follows:

- 1. Roll Call
- 2. Prayer
- 3. Pledge of Allegiance
- 4. Approval of Agenda
- 5. Approval of Previous Meeting Minutes
- 6. Reading of Communications
- 7. Citizen Participation
- 8. Presentation of Resolutions
- 9. County Administrator's Report
- 10. Committee Reports
- 11. Old/New Business
- 12. Executive Session
- 13. Appointments
- 14. Chair's Appointments
- 15. Adjournment

ARTICLE IV Members

A. All members of the County Board of Legislators shall attend all regular and specially scheduled meetings of the Board of Legislators, all duly called meetings of any special or standing committees of which any of the said Legislators are members, unless they are absent by reason of sickness, or excused by the Chair of the appropriate body.

- B. No member shall speak or debate until he/she has received recognition from the Chair.
- C. No member shall speak a second time to a question, as long as any member desires to speak who has not spoken to the question.

ARTICLE V Non-members

Citizens may speak before the Board of Legislators in one of the following ways:

- A. During Citizen Participation period, upon recognition by the Chair. The Speaker will state his/her name and is limited to five minutes. The total Citizen Participation time period shall not exceed thirty [30] minutes, unless extended at the discretion of the Chair.
- B. During the "Presentation of Resolutions" by being granted the floor by the Chair upon request of a Legislator. The citizen may speak on the current agenda item only.

ARTICLE VI **Resolutions**

- A. The term "resolution" as herein used, shall mean a formal proposed action in writing, by one or more of the Legislators, and/or a Committee of the Legislature. Upon introduction, the resolution shall be read by the Clerk upon request. The motion for adoption shall be properly seconded immediately, preceding any debate on the main question.
- B. A member sponsoring a resolution shall file with the Clerk of the Legislature a copy of said resolution one week prior to the Regular Meeting, at which it is to be introduced. Copies of it, and the entire agenda, shall be sent to each Legislator to arrive no later than three days preceding the Regular Meeting.
- C. Any resolution approved by a committee and forwarded to the Board for consideration may only be withdrawn upon the approval of the Board.
- D. Individual Legislators who wish to have their names added, as co-sponsors, to resolutions approved by a Committee may do so at the Committee Meeting by notifying the Deputy Clerk of the Board.

ARTICLE VII Committees

A. The Chair and Vice-Chair of the Board of Legislators shall be ex-officio members of all standing and special committees with all the rights & privileges thereof. Except that if both the Chair of the Board and Vice-Chair of the Board are present at a committee meeting, ONLY the Chair will have voting privilege unless the Vice-Chair is a designated member of the Standing Committee, then both would have voting privilege.

- B. The Chair of the Board shall appoint the members and designate the Chair of all standing committees within ten days following his/her election. He/she shall also appoint the members and designate the Chair of all special committees or subsequently created standing committees within ten days following creation thereof.
- C. Any vacancy occurring on any standing or special committee shall be filled by the Chair of the Board within thirty days after such vacancy occurs. In the event that such vacancy occurs in the position of Committee Chair, the Board Chair shall designate a new Committee Chair.
- D. All committee appointments serve until new appointments are made by the Chair.
- E. No member shall be Chair of more than one standing committee.
- F. Each Standing or Special Committee shall perform the duties, so designated by the rules of the Board of Legislators, or as assigned by the Chair of the Board.
- G. The Chair of each Standing or Special Committee shall be the presiding officer and shall cause the members thereof to be notified in advance of each meeting. The Committee Chair shall call all necessary meetings. Upon his/her refusal or neglect to call any meetings, the Clerk of the Board, upon written request signed by the Chair of the Board or by a majority of the Committee, shall call such meeting.
- H. A quorum for all committees shall be a majority of the membership of the Committee. Once a quorum has been established, a majority of the Committee members present is sufficient to approve or disapprove a proposed action.
- I. There shall be the following Standing Committees and their duties shall be those required by law, as directed by the Chair of the Board, or as so designated herein:

OPERATIONS COMMITTEE: Issues within the jurisdiction of this committee would be those arising out of the following departments: Board of Elections, Conflict Defender, County Clerk, District Attorney, Emergency Services, Governmental Services, Human Resources, Information Technology, Planning, Probation, Public Defender, and Sheriff, the expenditure of money not already appropriated and the transfer of funds.

SERVICES COMMITTEE: Issues within the jurisdiction of this committee would be those arising out of the following departments: Community Services, Office for the Aging, Public Health, Social Services, Veterans Services, Weights and Measures, and Youth Bureau, and the expenditure of money not already appropriated and the transfer of funds.

FINANCE COMMITTEE: Within the jurisdiction of this committee would be issues which would incur the expenditure of money not already appropriated; the issuance of bonds and payments thereon and the transfer of funds. Issues arising from the Board of Legislators, Office of the County Attorney, Office of the County Treasurer, Office of Real Property Tax Service, the Highway Department and the Solid Waste Department

shall be under the jurisdiction of this committee, as well as issues involving any outside agencies that are not currently funded within other departmental budgets, such as the Partner Agencies: Cornell Cooperative Extension, Chamber of Commerce, Soil and Water Conservation District, Forestry, IDA, and Historical Association.

Special Committees may be created as needed. Any resolution or action by the Chair establishing a Special Committee shall specify powers, duties, and duration. Special Committees shall include the Labor-Management Committee. Each special committee shall report to the appropriate standing committee or full Board as directed by the Chair. These reports shall be at least quarterly, and more often if needed. When the Committee has completed its work, a final written report shall be made.

- J. The Deputy Clerk of the Board shall arrange for the taking of minutes at all committee meetings and be responsible for their safekeeping. The minutes of each committee shall be kept in a separate minute book provided by the Clerk of the Board of Legislators. The minutes shall contain the time and place and persons present at the meeting; a record of all committee votes and other actions. Written statements by members or non-members may be submitted and shall become a part of the record of the committee. Written summaries may be required by the Committee Chair. The minute book shall be filed in the Office of the Clerk of the Board of Legislators and open to the public. Written Committee minutes and agendas will be posted to Google Drive for the Legislators and be available on the St. Lawrence County website for the public.
- K. Committee Procedures
 - 1. Committees shall meet in accordance with the 2020 Meetings Schedule. Regular Committee Meetings shall begin at 5:30 p.m. When the Chair of a Committee calls special meetings, it shall be the intent of this Board that public announcement thereof will be done as soon as possible.
 - 2. County Departments must submit any resolution for Committee consideration with the Clerk of the Board by the submission deadline as indicated on the 2020 Meeting Schedule.
 - 3. Rules for Legislators wishing to submit a resolution for committee consideration:
 - a. If the resolution is to be in the committee packet, then it must be submitted by the submission deadline, or
 - b. If the resolution is to be on a revised committee agenda, then it must be received by close of business the Friday before the regular committee meeting, or
 - c. If during discussion of any agenda item then by motion with or without a copy of the resolution, or
 - d. If under old/new business, then by motion with or without a copy of the resolution.

- 4. Within three days of its introduction, any and every resolution, which has not been acted upon by the Board shall be referred by the Chair to the appropriate committee.
- 5. Every resolution referred to any committee shall be placed on the regular agenda of that committee in chronological order of receipt in committee.
- 6. Within six weeks of its referral to committee, every resolution shall be reported back to the Board of Legislators with the committee's recommendation either favorable or unfavorable, and with minority reports, if any.
- 7. When any resolution is being considered by a committee, its proponent or any other legislator may come before the Committee and speak for or against the resolution. Any member of the public wishing to address the Committee on an agenda item may, upon nomination by a Legislator and recognition by the Chair, speak for or against the measure. The Committee may set a time limit of not more than five minutes on how long each individual may speak.
- 8. A member of the public who wishes to be on the agenda shall contact the Board Office, by submission date, eleven (11) days in advance of a committee meeting, and request to be put on the agenda. The Board of Legislators' Office will discuss the matter to be put on the agenda with the Chair of the Committee, and at the Chair's discretion, may or may not add the matter to the agenda for the next committee meeting, or a future committee meeting.
- 9. All presentations to Committees, which are unrelated to resolutions on the agenda, will be limited to a ten-minute presentation and a ten-minute question session.
- 10. In accordance with County Law Article 4, Section 154, committees have no power to do anything by which the County may become obligated and all of their actions must be reported to and sanctioned by the Board.

ARTICLE VIII Limitations and Amendment

- A. Notwithstanding any provisions herein contained, any decision of any committee or Chair thereof, or of the Chair of the Board of Legislators, may be overruled by a majority vote of the Legislature.
- B. These rules may be suspended by a two-thirds vote of the total membership of the Legislature at any meeting of the Legislature upon the following conditions:
 - 1. The Legislator requesting the Suspension of the Rules shall provide an explanation of the necessity for the Suspension of the Rules.

- 2. A copy of the resolution to be offered under Suspension of the Rules shall be on the desk of each Legislator at the beginning of the meeting or placed there before a vote is taken.
- C. These rules may be rescinded or changed by a majority vote of the total membership of the Board of Legislators at any meeting of the Board of Legislators, provided each member has had ten days written notice of the proposed change.
- D. Questions of Order and procedure not governed by these rules, or the laws of the State of New York, shall be decided according to Robert's Rules of Order Revised. The Legislature shall provide a desk copy of a current edition of Robert's Rules of Order Revised for each member.
- E. For purposes of a reconsideration vote, the next monthly meeting is considered to be the "next succeeding day" to our previous session. (rf. Roberts Rules of Order Revised, Section 36, page 156).
- F. A Legislator will be permitted to abstain from voting if he/she declares a conflict of interest.
- G. At each meeting of the Board, the roll call votes will be on a rotation basis with the first roll call of the year starting with District One. Thereafter, the first roll call of each Board Meeting shall start with the next person in the rotation as determined by the rotation of the Roll Call Vote Program.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County Treasurer is authorized to deposit money in accordance with the St. Lawrence County Investment Policy, and this policy authorizes the Treasurer to deposit funds, not needed temporarily, in certificates of deposit, Money Market Accounts, United States Treasury Bills, repurchase agreements, and day-of-deposit to day-ofwithdrawal savings account, at prevailing interest rates in any bank authorized for the deposit of County funds as per this resolution, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the total deposits, excluding United States Treasury Bills, are not to exceed the amounts authorized by this resolution, and are to be secured as required by Article 10 of the General Municipal Law and as outlined by the County's Investment Policy.

INVESTMENT POLICY FOR ST. LAWRENCE COUNTY

I. <u>SCOPE</u>

This investment policy applies to all moneys and other financial resources available for investment by the County or on behalf of any other entity or individual.

II. <u>OBJECTIVES</u>

The primary objectives of the County's investment activities are, in priority order:

- * to conform with all applicable federal, state and other legal requirements;
- * to adequately safeguard principal;
- * to provide sufficient liquidity to meet all operating requirements;
- * to obtain a reasonable rate of return;
- * to make every effort to invest locally.

III. <u>DELEGATION OF AUTHORITY</u>

The responsibility of the Board of Legislators for administration of the investment program is delegated to the County Treasurer, who shall maintain written procedures for the operation of the investment program consistent with these investment guidelines. Such procedures shall include an adequate internal control structure to provide a satisfactory level of accountability based on a database or records incorporating description and amount of investments, transaction dates, and other relevant information and regulate the activities of subordinate employees.

IV. <u>PRUDENCE</u>

All participants in the investment process shall seek to act responsibly as custodians of the public trust and shall avoid any transaction that might impair public confidence in the St. Lawrence County Legislature to govern effectively.

Investments shall be made with judgment and care, under circumstances then prevailing, which persons of prudence, discretion and intelligence exercise in the management of their own affairs, not for speculation, but for investment, considering the safety of the principal as well as the probable income to be derived.

All participants involved in the investment process shall refrain from personal business activity that could conflict with proper execution of the investment program, or which could impair their ability to make impartial investment decisions.

V. <u>DIVERSIFICATION</u>

It is the policy of the County to diversify its deposits and investments by financial institution, by investment instrument, and by maturity scheduling.

VI. INTERNAL CONTROLS

It is the policy of the County for all moneys collected by any officer or employee of the government to transfer those funds to the Treasurer within 5 days of deposit, or within the time period specified in law, whichever is shorter.

The Treasurer is responsible for establishing and maintaining an internal control structure to provide reasonable assurance that deposits and investments are safeguarded against loss from unauthorized use or disposition, that transactions are executed in accordance with management's authorization and recorded properly, and are managed in compliance with applicable laws and regulations.

VII. <u>DESIGNATION OF DEPOSITORIES</u>

The County Legislature, at its annual organizational meeting each January, shall designate the banks authorized for the deposit of moneys and the maximum amount, which can be deposited at each bank.

VIII. COLLATERALIZING OF DEPOSITS

In accordance with the provisions of General Municipal Law, all deposits of St. Lawrence County, including certificates of deposit and special time deposits, in excess of the amount insured under the provisions of the Federal Deposit Insurance Act shall be secured:

1. By a pledge of eligible securities with an aggregate market value as provided by General Municipal Law, equal to aggregate amount of deposits.

2. By an eligible irrevocable letter of credit issued by a qualified bank other than the bank with the deposits in favor of the government for a term not to exceed 90 days with an aggregate value equal to 140% of the aggregate amount of deposits and the agreed upon interest, if any. A qualified bank is one whose commercial paper and other unsecured short-term debt obligations are rated in one of the three highest rating categories by at least one nationally recognized statistical rating organization or by a bank that is in compliance with applicable federal minimum risk-based capital requirements.

3. By an eligible surety bond payable to the government for an amount at least equal to 100% of the aggregate amount of deposits and the agreed upon interest, if any, executed by an insurance company authorized to do business in New York State, whose claims-paying ability is rated in the highest rating category by at least two nationally recognized statistical rating organizations.

IX. SAFEGUARDING AND COLLATERALIZATION

Eligible securities used for collateralizing deposits shall be held by the depository or a third party bank or trust company subject to security and custodial agreements.

The security agreement shall provide that eligible securities are being pledged to secure County deposits together with agreed upon interest, if any, and any costs or expenses arising out of the collection or such deposits upon default. It shall also provide the conditions under which the securities may be sold, presented for payment, substituted or released and the events, which will enable the County to exercise its rights against the pledged securities. In the event that the securities are not registered or inscribed in the name of the County, such securities shall be delivered in a form suitable for transfer or with an assignment to the County or its custodial bank.

The custodial agreement shall provide that securities held by the bank or trust company, or agent of and custodian for, the County, will be kept separate and apart from the general assets of the custodial bank or trust company and will not, in any circumstances, be commingled with or become part of the backing for any other deposit or other liabilities. The agreement should also describe that the custodian shall confirm the receipt, substitution or release of the securities. The agreement shall provide for the frequency of revaluation of eligible securities and for the substitution of securities when a change in the rating of a security may cause ineligibility. Such agreement shall include all provisions necessary to provide the County a perfected interest in the securities.

X. <u>PERMITTED INVESTMENTS</u>

As authorized by General Municipal Law, the County Legislature authorizes the County Treasurer to invest moneys not required for immediate expenditure for terms not to exceed its projected cash flow needs in the following types of investments:

- * Special time deposit accounts
- * Certificates of deposits
- * Obligations of the United States of America
- * Obligations guaranteed by agencies of the United States
- * Obligations of the State of New York
- * Obligations issued by a municipality, school district or district corporation in New York State, other than the County
- * Obligations of public authorities, public housing authorities, urban renewal agencies and industrial development agencies where the general state statutes governing such entities or whose specific enabling legislation authorizes such investments
- * Through a Deposit Placement Program, certificates of deposit in one or more "banking institutions", as defined in Banking Law Section 9-r;

All investment obligations shall be payable or redeemable at the option of the County within such times as the proceeds will be needed to meet expenditures for purposes for which the monies were provided and, in the case of obligations purchased with the proceeds of bonds or notes, shall be payable or redeemable at the option of the County within two years of the date of purchase. When applying this requirement to repurchase agreements, the repurchase date and not the maturity of the underlying maturity, shall govern.

XI. <u>AUTHORIZED FINANCIAL INSTITUTIONS AND DEALERS</u>

The County shall maintain a list of financial institutions and dealers approved for investment purposes and establish appropriate limits to the amount of investments, which can be made with each financial institution or dealer. All financial institutions with which the local government conducts business must be credit worthy. Banks shall provide their most recent Consolidated Report of Condition (Call Report) at the request of the County. Security dealers not affiliated with a bank shall be required to be classified as reporting dealers affiliated with the New York Federal Reserve Bank, as primary dealers. The Treasurer is responsible for evaluating the financial position and maintaining a listing of proposed depositories, trading partners and custodians. Such listing shall be evaluated at least annually.

XII. <u>PURCHASE OF INVESTMENTS</u>

The Treasurer is authorized to contract for or place orders for the purchase of investments:

1. Directly, including through a repurchase agreement, from an authorized trading partner.

2. By participation in a cooperative investment program with another authorized governmental entity pursuant to Articles 5G and 3A of the General Municipal Law where such program meets all the requirements set forth in the Office of the State Comptroller Opinion No. 88-46, and the specific program has been authorized by the governing board.

3. By utilizing an ongoing investment program with an authorized trading partner pursuant to a contract authorized by the governing board.

4. By utilizing an ongoing investment program with an authorized investment adviser provided that all investments are directed by authorized personnel of the County, all trading partners are authorized by the designated Bank and the investment advisory agreement is approved by the Treasurer.

All purchased obligations, unless registered or inscribed in the name of the County, shall be purchased through, delivered to and held in the custody of a bank or trust company. Such obligations shall be purchased, sold or presented for redemption or payment by such bank or trust company only in accordance with prior written authorization from the officer authorized to make the investment. All such transactions shall be confirmed in writing to the Treasurer by the bank or trust company. Any obligation held in custody of a bank or trust company shall be held pursuant to a written custodial agreement as described in General Municipal Law.

The custodial agreement shall provide that securities held by the bank or trust company, as agent of and custodian for, the County, will be kept separate and apart from the general assets of the custodial bank or trust company and will not, in any circumstances, be commingled with or become part of the backing for any other deposit or other liabilities. The agreement shall describe how the custodian shall confirm the receipt and release of the securities. Such agreement shall include all provisions necessary to provide the County a perfected interest in the securities.

XIII. <u>REPURCHASE AGREEMENTS</u>

Repurchase agreements are authorized subject to the following restrictions:

- * All repurchase agreements must be entered into subject to a Master Repurchase Agreement.
- * Trading partners are limited to banks or trust companies authorized to do business in New York State and primary reporting dealers.
- * Obligations shall be limited to obligations of the United States or guaranteed by agencies of the United States.
- * No substitution of securities will be allowed unless the substitute securities are delivered to an independent custodian for the account of the County before the previously purchased securities are released.
- * The custodian shall be a party other than the trading partner.

WHEREAS, In 2016, St. Lawrence County began a new practice of preparing an annual Legislative Agenda for Representatives of the County in the Senate and the Assembly and these Agendas were adopted by the Board of Legislators in Resolution Nos. 149-2016, 192-2017, 121-2018, and 103-2019, and

WHEREAS, the importance of reviewing the agenda annually and updating the requests listed is critical to efficiently address current issues facing the County and to effectively measure the efforts of elected representatives in the Senate and Assembly on behalf of their districts in St. Lawrence County,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Legislators recommends the 2020 New York State Legislative Agenda for St. Lawrence County that addresses the following areas in a beneficial way for the County:

- Provide a permanency option for Home Rule Legislation for Sales Tax Extenders;
- Increase the threshold for highway contracts for CHIPS from \$250,000 to \$750,000;
- Provide direct insurance reimbursement for volunteer ambulance services;
- Additional funding for assessment/treatment/transition services in correctional facilities to assist with the Opioid Epidemic while opposing the bill associated with medication assisted therapies and the solitary confinement requirements;
- Acknowledge the shortfalls of bail reform and work to amend the law;
- Work to provide a cost effective solution with Medicaid and keep the current cap in place;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the one of the main concerns on all mandates where funding is provided, is that New York State be cognizant of the importance of timely payment for reimbursements associated with expenses incurred to carry out the Programs required by New York State, this is a critical component in the St. Lawrence County average of \$10M in overdue payments would provide stability to counties implementing state programs, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Legislators authorizes and directs staff to work on the narratives to include specific language, establish relevance and recommendations, and to develop a summary of related items that require action by New York State, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Legislators would like to express their appreciation for successful continuing efforts from the first four New York State Legislative Agendas, the Senate and Assembly Representatives of St. Lawrence County were successful with requests made that include:

- True two percent for the tax cap or tax levy limit to include New York State;
- Support the ability to collect sales tax on purchases made on the internet;
- Funding commence for evaluations/treatment of the opioid epidemic in correctional facilities;
- Create a unified primary election date;
- Establish a commitment to Consolidated Highway Improvement Program (CHIPs) funding to allow for better local capital planning and investments;
- Increase the threshold for highway contracts for CHIPS from \$250,000 to \$550,000;
- Fund the demolition and restoration of the former J&L Steel site in Star Lake as a State project to eliminate a severe and long-term blighted site from the Adirondack Park;
- Structure permanent sources of funding for implementation of the Raise the Age Legislation;
- Assume the financial obligation for the provision of criminal indigent defense services and related expenses;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Legislators is encouraged by the successful efforts made by the Senate and Assembly Representatives on behalf of St. Lawrence County and looks forward to continuing building on the success as issues related to funding local government continue to evolve, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that while State Representatives of St. Lawrence County have been successful in many key areas, there are some that remain and will require continued efforts including: funding for the recent changes to the Aid to Municipalities revenue source coming from county sales tax, administrative funding for the Septic Tank Program, shifting the cost of Preschool Programming to school districts, the consolidation of local courts, and expanding the weight limits for ATV registrations and creating the Trail Fund, as well as others identified in previous agendas, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Legislators authorizes the Chair to select a group of representatives from the County to travel to Albany and meet with appropriate State Representatives to deliver the 2020 Legislative Agenda and seek input on additional areas that would reduce the burden on the taxpayers in St. Lawrence County.

APPLAUDING THE RECENT DECISION OF HAMILTON COUNTY COURT JUDGE COFFINGER, THE NEWLY APPOINTED COURT PISTOL LICENSING AUTHORITY FOR ST. LAWRENCE COUNTY, IN ESTABLISHING A PROCEDURE AND IMPLEMENTING PROTOCOL FOR THE REMOVAL OF PISTOL LICENSE RESTRICTIONS

WHEREAS, in New York State a license to carry a firearm must be issued by the local licensing authority which is defined under Penal Law §265.00 (10), "Licensing officer" means in the city of New York the police commissioner of that city; in the county of Nassau the commissioner of police of that county; in the county of Suffolk the sheriff of that county except in the towns of Babylon, Brookhaven, Huntington, Islip and Smithtown, the commissioner of police of that county; for the purposes of section 400.01 of this chapter the superintendent of state police; and elsewhere in the state a judge or justice of a court of record having his office in the county of issuance., and

WHEREAS, in 2008, the Supreme Court of the United States issued the landmark ruling in *District of Columbia v. Heller*, which announced the Second Amendment protects an individual right to possess a firearm unconnected with service in a militia, and to use that arm for traditionally lawful purposes, such as self-defense within the home, and

WHEREAS, the *Heller* Court held that the individual right to bear arms, as codified in the Constitution, was a pre-existent right, not dependent on the permission of the government, as that right, through codification, "shall not be infringed," and

WHEREAS, despite the clear language of *Heller* and contemporaneous decision in *McDonald v. City of Chicago, Illinois*, States such as New York have continued to require its citizens to apply for permission to possess a pistol, rather than start from the operative clause presumption, that the right to bear arms is fundamental and individual, and may not be restricted in that fashion, and

WHEREAS, starting in 2009, St. Lawrence County Court Judge, as pistol licensing officer for St. Lawrence County, began placing certain restrictions on those licenses issued by the Court for concealed carry of a firearm, known as "Outdoor Sportsmen" restrictions, and

WHEREAS, these restrictions prohibited individuals who had validly issued licenses from carry their weapon concealed in any location other than to and from the home of the licensee and hunting, fishing, or berry-picking locations, and

WHEREAS, the Board of Legislators, since 2015, has raised numerous objections to the practice, passing not only a local law, but several resolutions, opposing the decision of the licensing authority, and

WHEREAS, in 2019, Board of Legislators authorized the County Attorney to assist the State of Louisiana and sixteen other states in filing an amicus brief in the U.S. Supreme Court seeking to challenge similar restrictions placed on pistol license holders in the City of New York, known as *New York State Rifle and Pistol Association, Inc. et. al. v. City of New York, State of New York et. al* case, which occurred and a decision is currently pending in the matter, and

WHEREAS, on January 1, 2020, Hamilton County Judge Coffinger assumed the responsibility of pistol licensing officer for St. Lawrence County, and

WHEREAS, on that same day, Judge Coffinger released a memorandum announcing that she would entertain applications for removal of previously imposed restrictions based upon the applicants ability to demonstrate appropriate gun safety education,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Legislators applauds the recent decision of the newly appointed court pistol licensing authority for St. Lawrence County to establish a procedure and implement protocol for the removal of pistol license restrictions, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this resolution be forwarded to Hamilton County Judge Tatiana Coffinger, Governor Andrew Cuomo, Senator Joseph Griffo, Senator Elizabeth Little, Senator Patty Ritchie, Assemblyman Mark Walczyk, Assemblyman Billy Jones, Assemblyman Robert Smullen, and Assemblyman Ken Blankenbush.

WHEREAS, St. Lawrence County residents have a proud history of gun ownership and stewardship, and

WHEREAS, varying standards employed by Pistol Licensing Authorities across New York State has resulted in the perception by local pistol licensees that they have been subjected to inequitable limitations on their licenses, and

WHEREAS, pistol license holders have long used the ability to cross-register pistols on multiple licenses as a means of estate planning within families so that an elderly family member may pass the weapon to a licensed heir without undue legal complications, and

WHEREAS, this provided separate residence cross-registration permits pistol license holders with comfort in the notion that the validly licensed pistol will not be neglected or destroyed due to inability of another to take swift possession of the property upon their passing, and

WHEREAS, in addition to the guidance provided by the current Pistol Licensing Authority in the memorandum of January 1, 2020, it was announced that pistol license holders would no longer be permitted to cross-register a pistol on two separate licenses where both license holders lived in separate households, and

WHEREAS, additional considerations have been announced that would provide for pistol license holders to request amendments to their current licenses to remove sportsman's restrictions if a safety course is completed, and this would appear to provide reprieve from the previous standards employed, the requirement of a safety course applies a new challenge to pistol license holders not required in all other counties, and

WHEREAS, the aforementioned examples of differing restrictions on pistol licensing standards highlight the difficulty with enforcing standards where no uniform standard across the State of New York, and

WHEREAS, the Board of Legislators is keenly aware of the challenges presented to any Pistol Licensing Authority when carefully considering eligibility,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Legislators calls upon the Pistol Licensing Authority to allow for cross registration of those permitted to possess firearms in St. Lawrence County with any other holder with licenses in the State of New York, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that restrictions or additional requirements be carefully considered by the pistol licensing authority when applied to cross registration or the implementation of a safety course upon a pistol permit applicant in St. Lawrence County.

WHEREAS, starting in 2009 St. Lawrence County Court Judge, as pistol licensing officer for St. Lawrence County, began placing certain restrictions on those licenses issued by the Court for concealed carry of a firearm, known as "Outdoor Sportsmen" restrictions, and

WHEREAS, these restrictions prohibited individuals who had validly issued licenses from carrying their weapon concealed in any location other than to and from the home of the licensee and hunting, fishing, or berry-picking locations, and

WHEREAS, since 2015, the Board of Legislators has raised numerous objections to the practice, and passed not only a local law, but several resolutions opposing the decision of the licensing authority, and

WHEREAS, on January 1, 2020, Hamilton County Judge Coffinger assumed the responsibility of pistol licensing officer for St. Lawrence County, and

WHEREAS, on that same day, Judge Coffinger released a memorandum announcing that she would entertain applications for removal of previously imposed restrictions based upon the applicants ability to demonstrate appropriate gun safety education, and

WHEREAS, limitations on the availability of classes within St. Lawrence County for pistol license holders has proven to create a difficulty for certain citizens to obtain the appropriate classes required as a pre-requisite to the removal of the license restrictions, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the memorandum released by Judge Coffinger, the Sheriff's Office has been identified as a party capable of providing the appropriate gun training and safety course, and

WHEREAS, the Sheriff has indicated his willingness to provide gun safety courses to residents for a nominal fee by trained and licensed gun safety instructors who have a proud history of gun ownership and stewardship, and

WHEREAS, protecting the people from harm by enforcing the rule of law is the foundational role of government, and

WHEREAS, County governments are vested by the State of New York with the responsibility to protect the most vulnerable among us, including the socioeconomically disadvantaged, the disabled, the elderly, and children, and

WHEREAS, no group is more vulnerable than the victims of crime, and a just society demands that crime victims should be recognized as key participants within the criminal justice system and be treated with dignity, fairness, and respect, and

WHEREAS, in the final stages of adopting its FY 2020 Budget, the State of New York enacted sweeping criminal justice reforms including the elimination of cash bail for many specific enumerated crimes and the imposition of stringent discovery mandates on police and prosecutors, and

WHEREAS, under bail reform, that took effect on January 1, 2020, judges were stripped of their discretion to set bail for many specific enumerated crimes, which means those suspected of committing these crimes can no longer be held in jail after their arrest, regardless of the strength of the case against these defendants, or the length of the potential sentence faced by these defendants, or the extent of the harm allegedly caused by these defendants, and instead these defendants will be released back into the general public, and

WHEREAS, these crimes include those that result in the deaths of innocent people, including several subcategories of homicide and manslaughter, resulting in those responsible for these deaths being released back into the community of grieving families, and

WHEREAS, these crimes include Making a Terroristic Threat and Money Laundering in Support of Terrorism in the third and fourth degree, resulting in those alleged to have supported terrorism in this manner, or who have threatened to commit acts of terrorism, being released immediately from police custody, and

WHEREAS, these crimes include Promoting an Obscene Sexual Performance by a Child; Possessing an Obscene Sexual Performance by a Child; Failure to Register as a Sex Offender; and Patronizing a Person for Prostitution in a School Zone, resulting in suspected child predators being released and returning to our communities, and

WHEREAS, these crimes include Aggravated Assault Upon a Person Less than Eleven Years Old; Reckless Assault of a Child by a Daycare Provider; Criminal Sale of a Controlled Substance to a Child; Abandonment of a Child; and Criminal Possession of a Weapon on School Grounds, resulting in those suspected to have physically harmed or endangered children in this manner being free from custody, and

WHEREAS, these crimes include Endangering the Welfare of a Vulnerable Elderly Person or an Incompetent or Physically Disabled Person, resulting in the potential for further endangerment of seniors and these defenseless individuals, and

WHEREAS, these crimes include Aggravated Cruelty to Animals; Torturing Animals and Injuring Animals, resulting in the immediate release of those suspected of deliberately injuring, torturing and killing animals, and

WHEREAS, these crimes include Assault in the Third Degree, Aggravated Vehicular Assault, and other crimes of physical violence against people, and

WHEREAS, these crimes include Burglary of a Residence, resulting in the immediate release of these individuals back into the neighborhoods they are suspected of targeting, and

WHEREAS, these crimes include Bail Jumping and Unlawfully Fleeing a Police Officer in a Motor Vehicle, resulting in release on recognizance of the very individuals who have demonstrated a propensity to evade the law, and

WHEREAS, all of the offenders mentioned heretofore are at risk of not showing up for court, thereby placing a burden on public employees who, under this law, are required to send multiple court appearance reminders to these offenders, as well as police officers and district attorneys who must commit resources to tracking and pursuing those who evade prosecution, and

WHEREAS, all offenders who are currently being held in custody for non-qualifying crimes including those mentioned heretofore were eligible for release from custody on January 1, 2020, and

WHEREAS, the discovery mandates imposed by the State of New York will require police and District Attorney to turn over voluminous trial-related materials to defense attorneys within 15 days, creating a mandate that will inevitably not be achieved in some cases and may result in the inability of the People to properly prosecute cases against criminal defendants, and

WHEREAS, protecting the people from harm by enforcing the rule of law is the foundational role of government, and

WHEREAS, county governments are vested by the State of New York with the responsibility to protect the most vulnerable among us, including the socioeconomically disadvantaged, the disabled, the elderly, and children, and

WHEREAS, no group is more vulnerable than the victims of crime, and a just society demands that crime victims should be recognized as key participants within the criminal justice system and be treated with dignity, fairness, and respect, and

WHEREAS, in the final stages of adopting its 2020 Budget, the State of New York enacted sweeping criminal justice reforms including the elimination of cash bail for many specific enumerated crimes and the imposition of stringent mandates related to materials called "discovery" on police and prosecutors, and

WHEREAS, these discovery mandates imposed by the State of New York will require police and district attorneys to turn over voluminous trial-related materials to defense attorneys within fifteen (15) days following the arrest, creating a mandate that will inevitably not be achieved in some cases and may result in the inability of the people to properly prosecute cases against criminal defendants, and

WHEREAS, discovery mandates may also result in an opportunity for defendants to gain access to crime scenes that may include the residence and contact information of a victim, thereby giving defendants accused of burglaries, assaults, rapes, and other crimes committed in homes of victims the right to return to those same homes, and

WHEREAS, discovery mandates will also require prosecutors to share the names and contact information of the victims and the witnesses to the defendant in the same fifteen (15) day time period, and

WHEREAS, the current law protects law enforcement personnel by allowing their personal identifying information to be excluded from discovery documents and records, but does not include protections for first responders, who may provide critical services at crime scenes, and

WHEREAS, ambulance services personnel, advanced life support first response services, certified first responders, firefighters, emergency medical technicians or advanced emergency medical technicians, who are employed by or enrolled members of any such service should also

have their personal identifying information protected from discovery, so they are not subject to retaliation or witness tampering, and

WHEREAS, on Friday, February 21, 2020, Governor Cuomo released his 30-day amendments to the Executive Budget which included a new proposal, "TED New Part JJJ", on the siting of renewable energy facilities, which include solar, wind, and other types of renewable energy facilities, and

WHEREAS, renewable energy projects that are currently being reviewed by the Public Service Commission under a process known as "Article 10" could use this new procedure that "fast tracks" renewable energy siting procedures, and

WHEREAS, the Governor's proposal would institute a new Article 23 of the Economic Development Law and create a new office, the Office of Renewable Energy Siting, under the Division of Economic Development which would be responsible for issuing permits for renewable energy facilities, and a decision would have to be rendered within one (1) year of the application being deemed complete, and

WHEREAS, if the Office of Renewable Energy Siting does not make a decision within one (1) year of the application by the developer, the application would be deemed approved, and additionally, the proposal creates Title 9-B under the Public Authorities Law, which gives NYSERDA authority to take necessary steps to secure permits, property interests and agreements to create "build-ready sites" for renewable energy projects, and

WHEREAS, the proposal removes the current Real Property Tax Law § 487(9)(a) requirement that the taxing jurisdiction (e.g.//town, school, county, etc.) notify a developer of its intent to require a Payment in Lieu of Taxes ("PILOT") agreement within sixty (60) days of having received notice and, instead, NYSERDA would have to be consulted in developing PILOT agreements, and

WHEREAS, Article 10, while arguably flawed, allowed for community involvement and local municipal input in that Applicants had to create a Public Involvement Plan; hold public statement hearings and trial-type evidentiary hearings; local municipalities had intervener status and could use intervener funds for purposes related to the proposed project, and

WHEREAS, the newly proposed TED New Part JJJ has removed most of these provisions in that while municipalities would still be able to apply for funds from a local agency account it is unclear how these could be accessed, and

WHEREAS, the new budgetary proposal would remove the requirement of an applicant to have a hearing unless the municipality can raise a "substantive or significant" issue that requires adjudication, and

WHEREAS, the Public Involvement Plan under Article 10 currently requires an applicant for a renewable energy project to give the potential host community notice that an application may be forthcoming, however, under TED New Part JJJ, language in the proposal would suggest that municipalities will not be given notice of a project until after the Office of Renewable Energy Siting already approves a draft permit, and

WHEREAS, under the current Article 10 process, projects 25MWs or smaller had to go through local zoning and a State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA) process however the TED New Part JJJ proposal reduces the megawatt threshold of projects that obtain a state permit from 25MWs to 10 MWs, thus removing local municipal authority over smaller renewable energy projects,

SETTING THE ALLOCATION ALGORITHM FOR WORKERS' COMPENSATION PLAN PARTICIPANTS FOR 2021, 2022, AND 2023

WHEREAS, St. Lawrence County established a Workers' Compensation Plan for county, city, town and village employees by Local Laws 1 and 2 of 1956, and

WHEREAS, Local Law 3 of 1993 provides that the apportionment algorithm shall be established for three (3) years, and

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 235-2017, adopted July 10, 2017, set the allocation algorithm for the St. Lawrence County Self-Insurance Plan participants for 2018, 2019, and 2020, and

WHEREAS, for the past fifteen (15) years the St. Lawrence County Workers' Compensation Plan has used an algorithm which, in whole or part, uses a three (3) year average of experience as percentages of the allocation, and the percentage is currently one hundred percent (100%) experience and actuarial based, and

WHEREAS, an allocation formula using risk and experience based rating places emphasis on safety in the work place, and

WHEREAS, an allocation formula in which the non-real property factor is based on the plan participants' payroll, employees' job risk categories and experience results in apportioning costs in a manner more closely related to factors generating risk that are in control of the participants,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Legislators sets the allocation algorithm for the St. Lawrence County Self-Insurance Plan participants for the years 2021, 2022 and 2023 as follows:

For the years 2021, 2022 and 2023, the allocation formula shall be 100% risk-payroll experience. This risk-payroll-experience amount shall be calculated as follows:

Payroll, excluding payroll for paid firefighters and fire drivers, for each participant shall be aggregated into \$100 units by New York Compensation Insurance Rating Board (NYCIRB) promulgated class code rates then in effect, and the resulting amount shall be adjusted by an experience modifier, which shall be calculated in accordance with generally accepted underwriting principles and, as approved by the County Attorney and the payroll attributable to a participant's paid firefighters, and paid fire drivers and the per capita charges for volunteer firefighters and volunteer rescue squad members shall not be attributed to all plan participants on a pro rate share for purposes of calculating the allocation of cost under this algorithm, and such attribution shall not change or affect the

employment relationship of paid personnel of the status of the relation of volunteers to the respective municipal participants, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the year-over-year loss development experience may be either a paid or incurred basis, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the St. Lawrence County Self-Insurance Plan Administrator may take appropriate steps to execute the directives and intent of this resolution and consistent with any other State law or local law or resolution of the Board of Legislators.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County Treasurer is authorized to deposit money in accordance with the St. Lawrence County Investment Policy, and this policy authorizes the Treasurer to deposit funds, not needed temporarily, in certificates of deposit, Money Market Accounts, United States Treasury Bills, repurchase agreements, and day-of-deposit to day-ofwithdrawal savings account, at prevailing interest rates in any bank authorized for the deposit of County funds as per this resolution, and that the County Treasurer may use his/her discretion in selecting any allowable bank under NY General Municipal Law for investment purposes only, up to a limit of \$10,000,000 per bank unless otherwise noted in this policy, a report of such investments must be provided to the Board of Legislators at the subsequent Finance Committee meeting, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the total deposits, excluding United States Treasury Bills, are not to exceed the amounts authorized by this resolution, and are to be secured as required by Article 10 of the General Municipal Law and as outlined by the County's Investment Policy.

INVESTMENT POLICY FOR ST. LAWRENCE COUNTY

I. <u>SCOPE</u>

This investment policy applies to all moneys and other financial resources available for investment by the County or on behalf of any other entity or individual.

II. <u>OBJECTIVES</u>

The primary objectives of the County's investment activities are, in priority order:

- * to conform with all applicable federal, state and other legal requirements;
- * to adequately safeguard principal;
- * to provide sufficient liquidity to meet all operating requirements;
- * to obtain a reasonable rate of return.
- * to make every effort to invest locally.

III. <u>DELEGATION OF AUTHORITY</u>

The County Legislature's responsibility for administration of the investment program is delegated to the County Treasurer, who shall maintain written procedures for the operation of the investment program consistent with these investment guidelines. Such procedures shall include an adequate internal control structure to provide a satisfactory level of accountability based on a database or records incorporating description and amount of investments, transaction dates, and other relevant information and regulate the activities of subordinate employees.

IV. <u>PRUDENCE</u>

All participants in the investment process shall seek to act responsibly as custodians of the public trust and shall avoid any transaction that might impair public confidence in the St. Lawrence County Legislature to govern effectively.

Investments shall be made with judgment and care, under circumstances then prevailing, which persons of prudence, discretion and intelligence exercise in the management of their own affairs, not for speculation, but for investment, considering the safety of the principal as well as the probable income to be derived.

All participants involved in the investment process shall refrain from personal business activity that could conflict with proper execution of the investment program, or which could impair their ability to make impartial investment decisions.

V. <u>DIVERSIFICATION</u>

It is the policy of the County to diversify its deposits and investments by financial institution, by investment instrument, and by maturity scheduling.

VI. INTERNAL CONTROLS

It is the policy of the County for all moneys collected by any officer or employee of the government to transfer those funds to the Treasurer within 5 days of deposit, or within the time period specified in law, whichever is shorter.

The Treasurer is responsible for establishing and maintaining an internal control structure to provide reasonable assurance that deposits and investments are safeguarded against loss from unauthorized use or disposition, that transactions are executed in accordance with management's authorization and recorded properly, and are managed in compliance with applicable laws and regulations.

VII. <u>DESIGNATION OF DEPOSITORIES</u>

The County Legislature, at its annual organizational meeting each January, shall designate the banks authorized for the deposit of moneys and the maximum amount, which can be deposited at each bank. Additionally, the County Treasurer may select any bank allowable under New York General Municipal Law for investment purposes only, up to a limit of \$10,000,000 per bank, unless otherwise noticed in this policy. Should the Treasurer invest in any bank not already designated at the annual organizational meeting, yet allowable under New York Municipal Law, the Treasurer must provide a report to the Board of Legislators at the monthly Finance Committee following any such investment.

VIII. COLLATERALIZING OF DEPOSITS

In accordance with the provisions of General Municipal Law, all deposits of St. Lawrence County, including certificates of deposit and special time deposits, in excess of the amount insured under the provisions of the Federal Deposit Insurance Act shall be secured:

1. By a pledge of eligible securities with an aggregate market value as provided by General Municipal Law, equal to aggregate amount of deposits.

2. By an eligible irrevocable letter of credit issued by a qualified bank other than the bank with the deposits in favor of the government for a term not to exceed 90 days with an aggregate value equal to 140% of the aggregate amount of deposits and the agreed upon interest, if any. A qualified bank is one whose commercial paper and other unsecured short-term debt obligations are rated in one of the three highest rating categories by at least one nationally recognized statistical rating organization or by a bank that is in compliance with applicable federal minimum risk-based capital requirements.

3. By an eligible surety bond payable to the government for an amount at least equal to 100% of the aggregate amount of deposits and the agreed upon interest, if any, executed by an insurance company authorized to do business in New York State, whose claims-paying ability is rated in the highest rating category by at least two nationally recognized statistical rating organizations.

IX. SAFEGUARDING AND COLLATERALIZATION

Eligible securities used for collateralizing deposits shall be held by the depository or a third party bank or trust company subject to security and custodial agreements.

The security agreement shall provide that eligible securities are being pledged to secure County deposits together with agreed upon interest, if any, and any costs or expenses arising out of the collection or such deposits upon default. It shall also provide the conditions under which the securities may be sold, presented for payment, substituted or released and the events, which will enable the County to exercise its rights against the pledged securities. In the event that the securities are not registered or inscribed in the name of the County, such securities shall be delivered in a form suitable for transfer or with an assignment to the County or its custodial bank.

The custodial agreement shall provide that securities held by the bank or trust company, or agent of and custodian for, the County, will be kept separate and apart from the general assets of the custodial bank or trust company and will not, in any circumstances, be commingled with or become part of the backing for any other deposit or other liabilities. The agreement should also describe that

the custodian shall confirm the receipt, substitution or release of the securities. The agreement shall provide for the frequency of revaluation of eligible securities and for the substitution of securities when a change in the rating of a security may cause ineligibility. Such agreement shall include all provisions necessary to provide the County a perfected interest in the securities.

X. <u>PERMITTED INVESTMENTS</u>

As authorized by General Municipal Law, the County Legislature authorizes the County Treasurer to invest moneys not required for immediate expenditure for terms not to exceed its projected cash flow needs in the following types of investments:

- * Special time deposit accounts
- * Certificates of deposits
- * Obligations of the United States of America
- * Obligations guaranteed by agencies of the United States
- * Obligations of the State of New York
- * Obligations issued by a municipality, school district or district corporation in New York State, other than the County
- * Obligations of public authorities, public housing authorities, urban renewal agencies and industrial development agencies where the general state statutes governing such entities or whose specific enabling legislation authorizes such investments
- * Through a Deposit Placement Program, certificates of deposit in one or more "banking institutions", as defined in Banking Law Section 9-r;

All investment obligations shall be payable or redeemable at the option of the County within such times as the proceeds will be needed to meet expenditures for purposes for which the monies were provided and, in the case of obligations purchased with the proceeds of bonds or notes, shall be payable or redeemable at the option of the County within two years of the date of purchase. When applying this requirement to repurchase agreements, the repurchase date and not the maturity of the underlying maturity, shall govern.

XI. <u>AUTHORIZED FINANCIAL INSTITUTIONS AND DEALERS</u>

The County shall maintain a list of financial institutions and dealers approved for investment purposes and establish appropriate limits to the amount of investments, which can be made with each financial institution or dealer. All financial institutions with which the local government conducts business must be credit worthy. Banks shall provide their most recent Consolidated Report of Condition (Call Report) at the request of the County. Security dealers not affiliated with a bank shall be required to be classified as reporting dealers affiliated with the New York Federal Reserve Bank, as primary dealers. The Treasurer is responsible for evaluating the financial position and maintaining a listing of proposed depositories, trading partners and custodians. Such listing shall be evaluated at least annually.

XII. <u>PURCHASE OF INVESTMENTS</u>

The Treasurer is authorized to contract for or place orders for the purchase of investments:

1. Directly, including through a repurchase agreement, from an authorized trading partner.

2. By participation in a cooperative investment program with another authorized governmental entity pursuant to Articles 5G and 3A of the General Municipal Law where such program meets all the requirements set forth in the Office of the State Comptroller Opinion No. 88-46, and the specific program has been authorized by the governing board.

3. By utilizing an ongoing investment program with an authorized trading partner pursuant to a contract authorized by the governing board.

4. By utilizing an ongoing investment program with an authorized investment adviser provided that all investments are directed by authorized personnel of the County, all trading partners are authorized by the designated Bank and the investment advisory agreement is approved by the Treasurer.

All purchased obligations, unless registered or inscribed in the name of the County, shall be purchased through, delivered to and held in the custody of a bank or trust company. Such obligations shall be purchased, sold or presented for redemption or payment by such bank or trust company only in accordance with prior written authorization from the officer authorized to make the investment. All such transactions shall be confirmed in writing to the Treasurer by the bank or trust company. Any obligation held in custody of a bank or trust company shall be held pursuant to a written custodial agreement as described in General Municipal Law.

The custodial agreement shall provide that securities held by the bank or trust company, as agent of and custodian for, the County, will be kept separate and apart from the general assets of the custodial bank or trust company and will not, in any circumstances, be commingled with or become part of the backing for any other deposit or other liabilities. The agreement shall describe how the custodian shall confirm the receipt and release of the securities. Such agreement shall include all provisions necessary to provide the County a perfected interest in the securities.

XIII. <u>REPURCHASE AGREEMENTS</u>

Repurchase agreements are authorized subject to the following restrictions:

- * All repurchase agreements must be entered into subject to a Master Repurchase Agreement.
- * Trading partners are limited to banks or trust companies authorized to do business in New York State and primary reporting dealers.
- * Obligations shall be limited to obligations of the United States or guaranteed by agencies of the United States.
- * No substitution of securities will be allowed unless the substitute securities are delivered to an independent custodian for the account of the County before the previously purchased securities are released.
- * The custodian shall be a party other than the trading partner.

WHEREAS, the opportunities for the Chamber of Commerce to assist in increasing awareness and improve the revenue received has been incentivized by the new formula, and

WHEREAS, in 2019, the revenue received from Occupancy exceeded the budget by \$55,301 which is the highest occupancy tax received in over fifteen years of tracking, exceeding a half a million dollars, and

WHEREAS, the formula associated with the occupancy tax sharing with the Chamber of Commerce would then indicate that forty-five (45%) percent or \$190,411 of the five year average collected would be shared as well as seventy-five (75%) percent of every dollar received above that average (\$42,093),



In the event a renegotiated agreement or such other agreement is not reached on or before, September 1, 2020, then the City may notify the County pursuant thereto of its intention to adopt legislation instituting a City sales tax in an amount otherwise permitted by law, said tax to become effective as of December 1, 2021."

2. Except as expressly modified herein, all terms and provisions of the Agreement and the Amended Agreement are and remain in full force and effect and are hereby ratified and affirmed by the parties.

WHEREAS, in 2013, St. Lawrence County was one of few remaining counties in the State that had not previously increased its sales tax over the three (3%) percent sales tax authorized by Tax Law Section 1210, and

WHEREAS, subparagraph (iii) of the opening paragraph of Tax Law Section 1210 was amended effective July 31, 2013 to include St. Lawrence County in the group of counties authorized to impose sales and compensating use taxes at a rate that was one percent additional to the three percent rate for the period beginning December 1, 2013 and ending November 30, 2015, and

WHEREAS, on May 4, 2015, the St. Lawrence County Board of Legislators adopted Resolution No. 157-2015 requesting Home Rule Regulation of Sales and Compensating Use Tax to extend the sales tax rate as previously authorized from three percent (3%) to four percent (4%), and

WHEREAS, the economic environment at that time required the County to continue to impose the sales tax rate as previously authorized and extend through 2017 and again through 2020, and

WHEREAS, on or about April 5, 2020 New York State Senate Bill No. S7508B and New York State Assembly Bill No. 9508A, which constituted a portion of the New York State Budget, was passed and included "Item NN", and

WHEREAS, Item NN states, "Clause 41 of subparagraph (i) of the opening paragraph of section 1210 of the tax law, as amended by section 1 of subpart NN of part A of chapter 61 of the laws of 2017, is amended to read as follows: (41) The county of St. Lawrence is hereby further authorized and empowered to adopt and amend local laws, ordinances or resolution imposing such taxes at a rate that is one percent additional to the three percent rate authorized above in this paragraph for such county for the period beginning December first, two thousand thirteen and ending November thirtieth, two thousand [twenty] TWENTY-THREE;...", and

WHEREAS, the revenue anticipated from the extension of the additional one percent (1%) sales and compensating tax will provide the County with an opportunity to continue to deliver locally preferred services deemed vital to the community while continuing to fund mandates imposed by New York State,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Legislators approves amending Resolution No. 197-2013, "Extending the authorization of St. Lawrence County to impose an additional one percent of Sales and Compensating Use Taxes", for the period of December 1, 2020 through November 30, 2023, as follows:

<u>Section 1.</u> Resolution No. 197-2013, adopted by the Board of Legislators of St. Lawrence County, on August 19, 2013, imposing sales and compensating use taxes, as amended, is amended by deleting the current Section 1, and replacing it with the following language to become effective immediately upon expiration of the prior section.

> "Section 1. Imposition of general sales and compensating use taxes. There are hereby imposed in this county and there shall be paid all of the sales and compensating use taxes described in Article twenty-eight of the New York Tax Law as authorized by subdivision (a) of section twelve hundred ten of the Tax Law, at the rate of three percent. Pursuant to the authority of Section 1210 of the Tax Law, there is hereby imposed and there shall be paid an additional one percent rate of sales and compensating use taxes, for the period beginning December 1, 2013 and ending November 30, 2023. All the provisions of this resolution relating or applicable to the administration and collection of the taxes imposed by this section, including the applicable transitional provisions, limitations, special provisions, exemptions, exclusions, refunds and credits as set forth in this resolution, have the same force and effect as if those provisions had been incorporated in full into this section and had expressly referred to the additional taxes imposed by this section."

<u>Section 2.</u> Subdivision (e) (2) of Section 6 of Resolution 197-2013 enacted by the St. Lawrence County Board of Legislators on August 19, 2013 imposing sales and use taxes, as amended, is amended to read as follows:

"(2) The County shall, in accord with the Tax Law Section 1262 (c) revenue sharing agreement between the County and the City of Ogdensburg:

(i) Make the direct payments in cash to the City of 6.437389 percent of the net collections from the additional taxes imposed by this enactment at the rate of one percent (1%) for the period beginning December 1, 2020, and ending November 30, 2021 unless modified by further agreement, and

WHEREAS, St. Lawrence County is facing a public health crisis unlike any other in recent memory, and our citizens in both the private sector and public sector are on the front lines of this pandemic, and

WHEREAS, the COVID-19 pandemic has put stress on public and private healthcare systems, that are already stretched very thin, and

WHEREAS, the New York State Court system has issued guidance and directives to county treasurers and county attorneys in an effort to assist in accommodating those individuals facing foreclosure due to their inability to redeem tax delinquent parcels,

WHEREAS, the Treasurer and Board of Legislators are conscious of the fact that some individuals may have been economically adversely impacted by COVID-19 and may require additional time to pay their delinquent taxes, and

WHEREAS, the current local law requires that an auction be held on the second Saturday of September, with the last date of redemption occurring thirty (30) days prior to the auction, and

WHEREAS, Local Law No. 4 for the Year 2018 will require and amendment with regard to the real property tax foreclosure proceedings to permit for a later auction date, which would extend the time for those adversely impacted by COVID-19 to redeem their property, and

WHEREAS, a local law amending policy on acquisition and sale of tax delinquent property is being proposed, and the law requires that said Local Law adoption be preceded by a public hearing,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that a Public Hearing on the proposed Local Law B (No. ___) for the Year 2020, Amending Local Law D for the Year 2018, "Setting Policy on Acquisition and Sale of Tax Delinquent Property in St. Lawrence County" will be held at 5:45 p.m. on September 14, 2020, in the Legislative Board Room.

PROPOSED LOCAL LAW B (NO.___) FOR THE YEAR 2020, AMENDING LOCAL LAW D FOR THE YEAR 2018, "SETTING POLICY ON ACQUISITION AND SALE OF TAX DELINQUENT PROPERTY IN ST. LAWRENCE COUNTY"

BE IT ENACTED by the Board of Legislators of the County of St. Lawrence as follows:

- <u>Section 1</u>. This local law shall supersede and repeal all prior local laws regarding the real property tax foreclosure proceeding.
- <u>Section 2</u>. Pursuant to Article 11 of the Real Property Tax Law, The St. Lawrence County Legislature hereby exercises the following options for the collection of delinquent taxes in St. Lawrence County.
- <u>Section 3</u>. A minimum fee of \$150 shall be charged to each parcel with delinquent taxes on June 1 of the year following the tax bill. This fee shall be used to cover the costs involved in tax foreclosure primarily abstracting and legal fees.
- Section 4. The Tax Enforcement Officer is hereby empowered to take installment payments of delinquent taxes. Said installment payments shall have a payment term of 24 months with payments due every three months. The Tax Enforcement Officer shall add \$2 to all delinquent tax bills to cover the cost of notifying the taxpayer of this right. All Installment Agreements shall be entered into on or before September 30 of the year in which the tax becomes a lien. The Tax Enforcement Officer shall collect 25% of the tax due at the time the tax payer signs the Installment Payment Agreement. The remaining seven installments are payable every quarter, with the first one due on December 1, following the Installment Agreement.
- <u>Section 5</u>. The Tax Enforcement Officer, who is the County Treasurer, is hereby authorized to accept a deed in lieu of enforcement of collection of delinquent taxes under Article 11.
- <u>Section 6</u>. Except where prohibited by state law, prior owners will be permitted to purchase property acquired by the County in foreclosure for the amount of the back taxes, plus any assessed penalties, interest, and fees, no less than thirty days prior to the tax sale auction.
- Section 7. All property acquired by the County pursuant to Article 11, shall be sold in one of the following manners: a.) at a public auction held on the second Saturday in September of the auction year, b.) at a properly advertised private sale subject to approval by the St. Lawrence County Board of Legislators, or c.) at such date and in such manner as established by a validly issued Administrative Order, a validly issued Executive Order, subsequent superseding State statute, or valid order of a Court with jurisdiction over the matter. Such sales may also be held online if deemed necessary by the County Treasurer.
- <u>Section 8</u>. The County sells only its lien and interest, does not warrant title, and will convey only by quitclaim deed. No abstracts will be provided.
- <u>Section 9</u>. Any fees associated with the auction and conveyance of properties sold at public auction, to include auctioneer fees, buyer's premium, advertising fees, and recording fees will be the responsibility of the bidder.
- Section 10. At a public auction, the highest bidder must tender twenty percent (20%) of the bid or a fifty dollar (\$50.00) deposit, whichever is greater. In addition, the highest bidder is

responsible for any buyer's premium, auctioneer fees, and possible advertising fees payable by certified check, money order, cash or credit card. The balance is due within thirty (30) days, also payable by certified check, money order, cash or credit card. Confirmation of the sale by the St. Lawrence County Board of Legislators is unnecessary for Article 11 properties sold at public auction. The County must sell to the highest bidder unless the highest bidder defaults. Upon default of the highest bidder, the deposit will be forfeited, and the County reserves the right to accept the bid of the second highest bidder.

- Section 11. The former owner, and any other person who may be acting as an agent of the former owner, whether disclosed or undisclosed, is strictly prohibited from bidding at the auction.
- Section 12. Any bidder who owns property in St. Lawrence County and is delinquent in their taxes shall be prohibited from bidding at the auction. The term delinquent is defined as prior year tax delinquency. No other person who may be acting as an agent of this bidder shall be allowed to bid at the auction.
- <u>Section 13</u>. For properties with actual or suspected environmental contamination, application may be made to the Court in an effort to gain "Temporary Incidence of Ownership", granting St. Lawrence County the legal authority to enter such property and conduct an environmental investigation to determine the nature and extent of any environmental contamination which may exist at the property and the cost for addressing such contamination.
- <u>Section 14</u>. The costs to St. Lawrence County associated with addressing actual or suspected environmental contamination of a property, including investigative, cleanup and legal costs, may be charged to the assessed owner and included on the tax assessment roll. The prior owner shall have the right to redeem their property up until 30 days prior to the tax sale auction; however, such payment to redeem shall include all costs associated with addressing environmental contamination of a property funded by St. Lawrence County, including any investigative, cleanup and legal costs.
- Section 15. This local law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State.

RESOLUTION NO. 252-2020

ADOPTING PROPOSED LOCAL LAW B (NO.___) FOR THE YEAR 2020, AMENDING LOCAL LAW D FOR THE YEAR 2018, "SETTING POLICY ON ACQUISITION AND SALE OF TAX DELINQUENT PROPERTY IN ST. LAWRENCE COUNTY"

By Mr. Acres, Chair, Finance Committee

BE IT ENACTED by the Board of Legislators of the County of St. Lawrence as follows:

- Section 1. This local law shall supersede and repeal all prior local laws regarding the real property tax foreclosure proceeding.
- Section 2. Pursuant to Article 11 of the Real Property Tax Law, The St. Lawrence County Legislature hereby exercises the following options for the collection of delinquent taxes in St. Lawrence County.
- Section 3. A minimum fee of \$150 shall be charged to each parcel with delinquent taxes on June 1 of the year following the tax bill. This fee shall be used to cover the costs involved in tax foreclosure primarily abstracting and legal fees.
- Section 4. The Tax Enforcement Officer is hereby empowered to take installment payments of delinquent taxes. Said installment payments shall have a payment term of 24 months with payments due every three months. The Tax Enforcement Officer shall add \$2 to all delinquent tax bills to cover the cost of notifying the taxpayer of this right. All Installment Agreements shall be entered into on or before September 30 of the year in which the tax becomes a lien. The Tax Enforcement Officer shall collect 25% of the tax due at the time the tax payer signs the Installment Payment Agreement. The remaining seven installments are payable every quarter, with the first one due on December 1, following the Installment Agreement.
- Section 5. The Tax Enforcement Officer, who is the County Treasurer, is hereby authorized to accept a deed in lieu of enforcement of collection of delinquent taxes under Article 11.
- <u>Section 6</u>. Except where prohibited by state law, prior owners will be permitted to purchase property acquired by the County in foreclosure for the amount of the back taxes, plus any assessed penalties, interest, and fees, no less than thirty days prior to the tax sale auction.

- Section 7. All property acquired by the County pursuant to Article 11, shall be sold in one of the following manners: a.) at a public auction held on the second Saturday in September of the auction year, b.) at a properly advertised private sale subject to approval by the St. Lawrence County Board of Legislators, or c.) at such date and in such manner as established by a validly issued Administrative Order, a validly issued Executive Order, subsequent superseding State statute, or valid order of a Court with jurisdiction over the matter. Such sales may also be held online if deemed necessary by the County Treasurer.
- <u>Section 8</u>. The County sells only its lien and interest, does not warrant title, and will convey only by quitclaim deed. No abstracts will be provided.
- <u>Section 9</u>. Any fees associated with the auction and conveyance of properties sold at public auction, to include auctioneer fees, buyer's premium, advertising fees, and recording fees will be the responsibility of the bidder.
- Section 10. At a public auction, the highest bidder must tender twenty percent (20%) of the bid or a fifty dollar (\$50.00) deposit, whichever is greater. In addition, the highest bidder is responsible for any buyer's premium, auctioneer fees, and possible advertising fees payable by certified check, money order, cash or credit card. The balance is due within thirty (30) days, also payable by certified check, money order, cash or credit card. Confirmation of the sale by the St. Lawrence County Board of Legislators is unnecessary for Article 11 properties sold at public auction. The County must sell to the highest bidder unless the highest bidder defaults. Upon default of the highest bidder, the deposit will be forfeited, and the County reserves the right to accept the bid of the second highest bidder.
- Section 11. The former owner, and any other person who may be acting as an agent of the former owner, whether disclosed or undisclosed, is strictly prohibited from bidding at the auction.
- Section 12. Any bidder who owns property in St. Lawrence County and is delinquent in their taxes shall be prohibited from bidding at the auction. The term delinquent is defined as prior year tax delinquency. No other person who may be acting as an agent of this bidder shall be allowed to bid at the auction.
- Section 13. For properties with actual or suspected environmental contamination, application may be made to the Court in an effort to gain "Temporary Incidence of Ownership", granting St. Lawrence County the legal authority to enter such property and conduct an environmental investigation to determine the nature and extent of any environmental contamination which may exist at the property and the cost for addressing such contamination.

- Section 14. The costs to St. Lawrence County associated with addressing actual or suspected environmental contamination of a property, including investigative, cleanup and legal costs, may be charged to the assessed owner and included on the tax assessment roll. The prior owner shall have the right to redeem their property up until 30 days prior to the tax sale auction; however, such payment to redeem shall include all costs associated with addressing environmental contamination of a property funded by St. Lawrence County, including any investigative, cleanup and legal costs.
- Section 15. This local law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State.

WHEREAS, on an annual basis, the County Administrator provides a review of the work of the Vacancy Review Committee that includes updates such as number of positions considered, the percentages associated with timeliness of filling positions as well as other measured outcomes, and the annual report for 2019-2020 was presented at the August Finance Committee Meeting, and

WHEREAS, this year the savings associated with vacancy review has exceeded \$1.6 million and the Vacancy Review Committee has been instrumental in achieving those savings by evaluating the timing of recommending positions to be filled with policy guidance by the Board of Legislators, by reviewing positions to be abolished and created to meet department needs, and by not recommending positions be filled without additional information,

OPPOSING THE UNFUNDED MANDATE OF ENFORCEMENT OF THE EXECUTIVE ORDERS RELATED TO THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC AND CALLING UPON THE GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK TO REMOVE THE THREAT OF LOSS OF STATE AID CONDITIONED ON ENFORCEMENT

WHEREAS, on March 7, 2020, Governor Andrew M. Cuomo issued a declaration, pursuant to Executive Law § 29-a, that the State of New York was facing an emergency related to the COVID-19 pandemic outbreak, and

WHEREAS, since March 7th, 2020, Governor Cuomo has issued seventy (70) executive orders amending, modifying, suspending, and/or directing action related to hundreds of laws and regulations of the State of New York, and

WHEREAS, many of the Executive Orders (as many as 12 of the 70 orders) have directed local governments to enforce the provisions of the obligations through the imposition of fines and fees against those individuals alleged to have violated the requirements of the Governor's New York on P.A.U.S.E Program, and

WHEREAS, initially the directives of the Governor required that local governments enforce the individual mask mandate, social distancing measures, and population density reduction measures through the imposition of a fine on the individuals of up to \$1,000 per occurrence, and

WHEREAS, the Executive Orders were amended to empower local governments to impose a fine of as much as \$10,000 on businesses who failed to require individual patrons to observe the New York on P.A.U.S.E provisions, and

WHEREAS, on October 6th, Executive Order 202.68 was issued which modified the law and states, in pertinent part: "Sections 12 and 206 of the Public Health Law, to the extent necessary to, notwithstanding any other provision of this Executive Order, provide that any individual who encourages, promotes or organizes a non-essential gathering as set forth in Department of Health regulation, shall be liable for a civil penalty not to exceed \$15,000 per day; and Sections 12-a and 206(4) of the Public Health Law, to the extent necessary to authorize, at the direction of the Commissioner of Health or the Commissioner's representative, any local government official to assess, and the local government to retain, a civil penalty for violations of Executive Orders issued pursuant to Section 29-A of the Executive Law, or any regulations of the Department of Health, that impose requirements pertaining to maintaining social distance and wearing of face coverings, for the duration of this disaster emergency, and to conduct any hearing related to such penalties. Such penalties, if assessed on an individual basis, shall not exceed \$1,000 per violation, except as otherwise provided herein," and

WHEREAS, shortly thereafter, the Governor issued Executive Order 202.69, which states in pertinent part, "In furtherance of the protection of public health, and in recognition of the extreme consequences failure to adhere to the restrictions set forth in Executive Order 202.68 presents, the director of the budget is authorized to withhold any funds appropriated in the FY20 Enacted Budget to or for, directly or indirectly, a public or nonpublic school or school district and/or to a locality for the period of time that such school district, school or locality is found to have been in violation of Executive Order 202.68, or for the period of time that such school district, school, or locality is in violation of any order of the department of health issued pursuant to Executive Order 202.68," and

WHEREAS, on October 16, 2020, a control room conference call was held with representatives of the Governor who communicated to local government officials from across New York State that their inability or failure to impose fines on those perceived to be in violation of the Executive Orders would result in the State withholding local government aid, and

WHEREAS, during the same conference call, representatives of the Governor indicated that enforcement of the Executive Orders would be almost exclusively a local government responsibility, without the aid of the New York State Police and without any additional financial support from the State of New York, and

WHEREAS, during the same conference call, representatives of the Governor indicated that the citizenry of the County would be called upon to report on alleged violations of the Executive Orders and accuse alleged violators for the purpose of enforcement sanctions, and

WHEREAS, the 'deputizing' of local individuals has the potential to have children reporting parents, siblings reporting other siblings, and friends reporting friends for violations of the alleged executive orders, and

WHEREAS, the United States, the State of New York, and St. Lawrence County are facing a public health crisis unlike any experienced in approximately one-hundred years, and

WHEREAS, the COVID-19 pandemic is putting stress on public and private healthcare systems, as well as local law and public enforcement agencies (e.g.//Sheriff, County Administrator, County Attorney, Public Health, and the District Attorney) that are already stretched very thin, and

WHEREAS, St. Lawrence County and all county governments across New York State have been taking unprecedented steps to slow down the rate of infections with little to no support from the State of New York, and

WHEREAS, county healthcare workers, first responders, and all essential employees in the public sector are on the front lines of this pandemic, and

WHEREAS, this is the third time since March 7, 2020, where the Governor has specifically indicated that eligibility and receipt of State Aid for counties were endangered, and

WHEREAS, the Governor has specifically stated that if New York does not receive federal funding in a federal coronavirus stimulus bill, local government aid will be reduced by twenty percent (20%), and

WHEREAS, the Governor has also conditioned future state aid on the adoption of local police reforms by local governments pursuant to Executive Order 203, and

WHEREAS, the Executive Order disregards the Home Rule provisions of the New York State Constitution whereby local governments are free to craft local laws regarding public safety within the confines of the areas proscribed by the State Legislature, and

WHEREAS, the Executive Order ignores the constitutional authority vested within the State Legislature to appropriate funds and establish a State Budget, and

WHEREAS, the enforcement of the Executive Orders only applies to local governments and not to State police agencies, a glaring discrepancy that imposes an unfunded mandate upon local governments, and

WHEREAS, local governments should be supported and praised for their frequent sacrifices and their selfless service rather than be villainized under threat of harm to their constituents through the loss of State aid,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED the Board of Legislators oppose the unfunded mandate of enforcement of the Executive Orders related to the COVID-19 pandemic and calling upon the Governor of the State of New York to remove the threat of loss of State aid conditioned on enforcement, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED the Board of Legislators calls upon the State of New York to assume the responsibility of enforcement of their own directives or, in the alternative, provide additional funding to support the efforts at the local government level, and
