#### 1. RECOVER VITAL is our Long COVID study

- a. Long COVID/Post-acute sequelae SARS-CoV-2 Infection (PASC): broadly defined as signs, symptoms, and conditions that continue or develop after initial COVID-19 infection

- c. Funded by: NIH
- d. Sponsor: Duke University
- e. Principal Investigator: Dr. Eyal Kedar

#### 2. TRITON is our Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease study

- a. Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease (COPD): a group of diseases that cause airflow blockage and breathingrelated problems. It includes emphysema and chronic bronchitis

## 3. TULIP is our Systemic Lupus Erythematosus study

- a. Systemic Lupus Erythematosus (SLE): an autoimmune disease in which the immune system attacks its own tissues, causing widespread inflammation and tissue damage in the affected organs. It can affect the joints, skin, brain, lungs, kidneys, and blood vessels

### **Lead Update: Carly Zimmermann**

- Lead Detailing Materials
  - o Detailing staff member will help with the removal of patients from NYSIIS.
  - Asked if any provider on the BOH would be willing to be a Champion of the detailing effort
     Dr. Terrence volunteered.
  - Asked if providers wants lists of patients for their clinics Dr. Healey and Dr. Terrence interested in receiving their lists.
  - o Education provided on the impact of lead testing on your child media outlets, etc.
  - Rita noted years ago new parents were provided a checklist of what was required for their child's age milestones.
  - o Information on Lead Testing was included in our Back-to-School information.
  - o Dr. Healey noted parents should be the target here they should be responsible parents.
  - o Dr. Terrence noted "What are barriers to lead testing?" should be included in the survey.
  - Dr. Terrence asked if the Public Health Department/Lead Program is prepared for the increase in cases a Public Health Specialist (PHS) is dedicated specifically to the Lead Program. Another PHS and Public Health Nurse (PHN) are training to cover when this staff member goes on leave.
- Lead Point of Care Testing
  - o Dr. Williams noted, per the Lab Director, training is taking place. Point of Care testing should be at Canton Pediatrics, Potsdam Pediatrics and Kid's Corner soon.
