








Mental Health Visits Per Seven Hours

Mental Health Weighted Face to Face





This Public Health Program Aide (PHPA) position is necessary for two functions within the Public Health Department. The individual will be responsible for: 1. assisting with the COVID-19 response: contact tracing and daily monitoring of current individuals in guarantine, sending isolation/guarantine orders, ordering and tracking COVID-19 needs (thermometers, masks), and data management of case files, and 2. Prevent program work: compiling data for statistical reports related to immunization, lead, communicable disease, and rabies, assisting with immunization, STI, and rabies clinics, ordering and maintaining appropriate immunization, STI and rabies clinic inventory. conducting preliminary interviews for clients, completing data entry and documentation for the immunization clinic and IAP grant, and meeting data entry deadlines for reporting sensitive confidential information to New York State Department of Health.
