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A Message From the Director

Dear New Yorkers:

Nearly three million LGBTQ+ people are age 50 and older in the U.S. This population will grow to nearly seven million by 2030. Of the estimated 800,000 LGBTQ+ adults in New York State, nearly one-third – or 28 percent – are over the age of 50.

The New York State Office for the Aging (NYSOFA) is committed to fostering inclusive, person-centered programs and services for LGBTQ+ adults as they age. This resource guide continues our efforts on that front. It provides important information for providers about the unique service needs of LGBTQ+ older adults, best practices for addressing those needs, and a directory of organizations who specialize in serving LGBTQ+ older adults so that you can connect with trusted organizations for additional assistance.

Further Information About This Guide

This guide builds upon NYSOFA's work with our stakeholder Advisory Council of Older LGBTQ+ New Yorkers. The Council includes representatives of AARP New York, the Association on Aging in NYS, and key stakeholders representing the LGBTQ+ community who have worked with NYSOFA to identify and overcome service gaps or barriers. Members of the Advisory Council have assisted NYSOFA and our partners across the state to improve LGBTQ+ cultural competency in the aging services system. These efforts have increased the participation of LGBTQ+ individuals on local aging advisory councils and led to the development of training and outreach strategies to improve service access.

Unique Needs of LGBTQ+ Older Adults

Over 5 percent of all New Yorkers, 3.8 percent of adults aged 55-64, and 2.3 percent of adults over the age of 65 openly identify as LGBTQ+. These numbers only represent those who self-identify and do not account for people who are questioning, or who may not feel comfortable publicly disclosing their sexual orientation and gender identity. As our overall population continues to age – and as more people are feeling comfortable publicly disclosing their identities – we can expect the population of LGBTQ+ older adults to increase over time.

Studies have shown in recent years that despite various efforts made for civil rights and inclusion, LGBTQ+ older adults are still experiencing discrimination when seeking aging-related services. For some, this fear and social stigma have disrupted their lives, their connections with their families of origin, their lifetime earnings, and their opportunities to save for retirement. Many are also apprehensive of health care providers for some of these same reasons.

LGBTQ+ older adults are less likely than heterosexual elders to access many services for the aging, including senior centers, meal programs, and other assistance programs because they fear discrimination or harassment if their sexual orientations or gender identities become known. Some LGBTQ+ older adults who access aging service agencies may also choose to remain closeted or private about their sexual orientation or gender identity, referring to partners, significant others, or loved ones as a "friend," "roommate," or "sibling." Other LGBTQ+ older adults may resist accessing aging services and agencies altogether and may only seek assistance for emergency care, going without preventive supports that could help address needs or conditions before they escalate to crisis levels.

LGBTQ+ Health and Social Disparities in Focus

In January 2021, AARP, SAGE and other advocates for LGBTQ+ older adults issued a report revealing that:

- 23 percent of LGBTQ+ New Yorkers of all ages cite inadequate insurance coverage as the most significant barrier to health care.
- One-third of LGBTQ+ adults aged 50 and over live at or below 200 percent of the federal poverty level, compared to a quarter of non-LGBTQ+ people.

- 21 percent of LGBTQ+ adults aged 50 and over have provided care to friends three-and-ahalf times the 6 percent of non-LGBTQ+ peers.
- Poverty rates are even higher for LGBTQ+ older people of color, those aged 80 and older, bisexual older people, and transgender older people.

Of the 800,000 people in New York who are LGBTQ+, nearly one-third are over the age of 50. Yet the AARP/SAGE report found that this population remains largely invisible to traditional aging network or human service providers. This finding is also well documented by organizations serving LGBTQ+ older adults who are facing disparities rooted in years of discrimination, lack of legal and social recognition, reduced access to inclusive services, and more. After decades of admirable resilience, LGBTQ+ older people are still facing negative health, economic, and social implications that demand action. These challenges have been magnified during the COVID-19 pandemic.

NYSOFA's Strategic Plan for LGBTQ+ Older Adults

NYSOFA has developed a strategic work plan to enhance services for LGBTQ+ older adults in New York State. This plan was drafted in coordination with the Association on Aging in NYS, AARP, and SAGE. It includes:

- Establishing a NYSOFA standing committee on LGBTQ+ Aging to identify challenges and barriers to service access and ways to mitigate them.
- Sharing of best practices and developing expert recommendations on an ongoing basis to improve the quality of life for LGBTQ+ adults age 50 and over.
- Work to increase the involvement of racially diverse LGBTQ+ populations representing stakeholder groups on the advisory councils and long-term care councils that local Area Agencies on Aging (AAAs) are required to organize.
- The inclusion of efforts being undertaken to assist LGBTQ+ older adults into NYSOFA's fouryear plan and AAA local planning and conducting quarterly stakeholder meetings to identify issues and best practices.
- Encouraging regular assessments of older LGBTQ+ adults' needs that can be accomplished through surveys, focus groups, and collected as part of the mandatory community assessments which are required for the development of local four-year plans.
- Facilitating training of service providers on unique needs of LGBTQ+ older adults.

NYSOFA has already incorporated questions to identify the needs of LGBTQ+ older adults within NYSOFA's Comprehensive Assessment for Aging Network Community (COMPASS), our primary screening instrument. This screening process assists in developing client-centered planning to provide any one of the seven supportive services, including case management, home health aides, adult day care services, and home-delivered meals.

Deliberations of NYSOFA's Advisory Council for Older LGBTQ+ New Yorkers and the Governor's cross-agency workgroup will build upon the tremendous accomplishments made in New York State to

increase access to community-based services and supports designed for LGBTQ+ older adults to help them age in place.

Key Findings on LGBTQ+ Competency and Resource Needs in the Aging Services Community

In the Spring of 2022, NYSOFA surveyed the Advisory Council of Older LGBTQ+ New Yorkers, AAAs, and other aging network providers to learn about the needs of service providers in delivering LGBTQ+ competent care, any issues or barriers they've confronted, and effective program models, outreach efforts or best practices. The following are some key findings:

- Approximately 34 percent of organizations serving LGBTQ+ New Yorkers had some involvement with the AAA Advisory Council in the county or counties they serve, with 19 percent serving as a member of the AAA Advisory Council in their community. Of those who were not involved in an Advisory Council, 26 percent indicated they were interested in involvement, presenting an opportunity area for AAAs to engage local LGBTQ+ service providers in more direct participation on local planning efforts.
- At least 56 percent of organizations had a contract with a AAA to serve older adults. Approximately 25 percent did not have a contract. (The remaining individuals answered "not applicable" or some other arrangement.)
- Most survey respondents expressed some degree of confidence in their abilities to serve the LGBTQ+ community. For instance, 63 percent of organizations "mostly agreed" or "agreed" that their organization provided excellent service to LGBTQ+ older adults.
- Organizations also shared information about existing service and resource gaps, with 7
 percent saying there are not many resources in their area for lesbian, gay, and bisexual+ older
 adults, and nearly 9 percent saying there were not many resources in their area for
 transgender and gender non-conforming/non-binary older adults.
- Respondents were asked to describe any issues or challenges they encountered serving LGBTQ+ older adults. The most prominent issue was that clients or service recipients have expressed privacy concerns about discussing their gender/sexual orientation (37 percent cited this as a concern). Also, 33 percent said staff express concerns about their ability to approach the subject of gender/sexual orientation appropriately. These findings highlight the need for resources and training to help aging services providers initiate conversations on gender and sexual orientation. Indeed, nearly 82 percent of respondents said they would like additional training in LGBTQ+ cultural competency.

SageCare Certified Area Agencies on Aging

SAGECare is SAGE's training and consulting division that assists senior care agencies in creating fully LGBT-inclusive services. SAGECare training covers basics about what LGBT means, stories of real LGBT older adults, skills to work with LGBT older adults, and suggested improvements across multiple departments. If SAGECare has trained an agency staff, the agency is eligible to receive a SAGECare credential and display it on marketing materials and at their locations. NYSOFA and the Association on Aging in New York are working with counties to increase the number of SAGECare-certified Area Agencies on Aging.

SAGECare certifications include four levels. To earn each level of certification, an organization must meet the following minimum levels of training:

- **Platinum**: 80% of employees received 1 hour of LGBT Aging Training and 80% of Executive/Administrators received 4 hours of LGBT Aging Training
- **Gold**: 60% of employees received 1 hour of LGBT Aging Training and 60% of Executive/Administrators received 4 hours of LGBT Aging Training
- **Silver**: 40% of employees received 1 hour of LGBT Aging Training and 40% of Executive/Administrators received 4 hours of LGBT Aging Training
- **Bronze**: 25% of employees received 1 hour of LGBT Aging Training
