1. Training and Guest Presentations:

- County Land Use Plan Addendum topics (location and number of EV charging stations, tiny homes);
- Approval or denial timing, hearing and decision dates.
- State freshwater wetland regulation changes

Lower Priority

- Emerald Ash Borer Hazard Tree Assessment and removal initiative;
- Cannabis regulations;
- Presentation by American Farmland Trust on its Smart Solar Siting Report;
- Examine expansion of the State bottle redemption law.
