NYS Electronic Equipment Recycling and Reuse Act

The New York State Electronic Equipment Recycling and Reuse Act was signed into law back in May of 2010 by Governor Patterson. In short, the law requires manufacturers of electronic equipment to provide convenient and *FREE* collection and recycling of Covered Electronics Equipment (CEE) beginning April 1, 2011.

CEE material includes computers (as well as accessories such as monitors, keyboard and printers), televisions, and "small electronic equipment," which includes portable digital music players, video recorders and video game consoles (see below for a full list of materials).
