St. Lawrence County Teen Sextortion and Suicide Awareness Campaign

- Partnership with local Law Enforcement, FBI, Sherrif's Dept, District Attorney's office, Homeland Security, and several human service organizations
- Law Enforcement and Human Service Organizations are assigned to Youth Committee Ambassadors and schools
- 2 pronged message-
 - You don't know who you are really communicating with on social media, and you should not send images or texts that you don't want shared with others.
 - If something goes wrong, even terribly wrong, in social media interactions (or any circumstance) all is not lost. There are people who can help and friends to support you.

- Art Work and Video Campaign Contest
 - Video length-no longer than 3 minutes
 - Due date-Friday, May 6th
 - Judging
- Flyers & Posters
- Online Registration Process
 - This allows Teen Ambassadors to reach out to the participants
- Teen Survey
 - All responses will be anonymous
- Schools with gaps and/or gaps with supporting adults
- Universal Presentations for County Consistency
 - Subcommittee formation
- Break Out Rooms
 - Teen Ambassadors, Law Enforcement, and Human Service Representatives get to meet one another and discuss next steps
 - Next steps
 - Launch Art design and video contest at each school
 - Meet, in person, 1-2 times before contest deadline (May 6th)
 - Support campaign participants
 - Round table discussions
 - Hands-on activities such as:
 - How to spot online predators, how to disengage from them, reporting, and going to an adult for help
 - How to identify signs of a person in crisis and lead them to help
